1. **Call to Order**

Board Chair, Shelley Huffman, called roll, declared a guorum present, and called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

2. **President's Report**

- President Tomblin introduced Mrs. Patricia Cutlip, Account for the Southern 1. West Virginia Community College Foundation, to the group. Mrs. Cutlip gave a progress report of Foundation activities and informed the Board that S. R. Snodgrass, Certified Public Accountants and Consultants of Wheeling, WV, are preparing single-year audited financial statements for the Foundation that should be completed by April 30, 2005.
- The Major Gifts Campaign remains in the guiet phase with employee donation 2. solicitations currently underway. To date, employee commitment contributions total \$96,000. Chair Shelley Huffman is currently conducting solicitations of the Foundation Board, and Secretary Rory Perry is conducting solicitation of Southern's Board of Governors. Mr. Terry Purdy, Cargill Associates Consultant, will provide a Major Gifts Campaign report at the June 21 Board meeting.
- Harmony Week culminated with a multi-cultural luncheon on Friday, March 4, 3. 2005, at the Earl Ray Tomblin Convention Center in Chapmanville. Dr. Nelson B. Rivers, III, Chief Operating Officer of the NAACP, was the guest speaker. More than 300 persons attended the event.
- High school and middle school visits are complete for the year and will 4. resume Fall 2005.
- 5. President Tomblin created a task force for the Williamson Campus due to low student enrollment. The groups first meeting is scheduled for April 21. Ms. Jada Hunter will represent the Board on the task force, and Ms. Patricia Clay will serve as group facilitator.
- President Tomblin, Merle Dempsey, and Fred Scott met with General Major 6. Allen E Tackett on March 30, 2005, to discuss acquisition of the Williamson

National Guard Armory building located beside the Williamson Campus. General Major Tackett indicated that Southern will be able to purchase the building for approximately one-third of the property appraisal value.

- 7. President Tomblin established a Blue Ribbon Committee on Recruitment, Retention and Graduation to determine the barriers for our students. Cochairs are Ms. Cathy Smith-Cox and Roy Simmons. The group will develop a plan by the end of next year.
- 8. The Regional Educational Service Agency (RESA) Region II Math Field Day competition was held at the Logan Campus on Friday, March 11, 2005, to determine the top students to advance to the state level. The event is for students in grades 4-12 who have qualified by scoring high enough on math tests at the county level. RESA Region II includes schools in Cabell, Lincoln, Logan, Mason, Mingo, and Wayne counties. For the state competition, each of eight Regional Educational Service Areas (RESAs) sends three students in each grade level 4-9 to represent their region, and ten students per RESA take part in the 10-12 competition.
- 9. Higher Education Day at the Legislature was March 15, 2005. The annual event salutes West Virginia's higher education public and independent colleges and universities, and provides potential students, legislators, and others with an opportunity to learn more about postsecondary opportunities.
- 10. Nurses Unity Day at the Legislature was held March 31, 2005.
- 11. The Dental Hygiene Program accreditation visit was held April 12-13, 2005.
- 12. The West Virginia Small Business Development Center accreditation visit was conducted March 29, 2005.
- 12. Early registration for the fall 2005 semester began April 1.
- 13. As prescribed in West Virginia Code §18B-6-6(f), the President's quarterly meeting with the Classified Staff Council was held April 1, 2005, to discuss matters affecting classified employees.
- 14. President Tomblin held an open forum for employees at the Wyoming Campus on April 18.
- 15. Facilities update:
 - 1. Mr. Bill Grizzell is moving along with construction of the Lincoln County High School project which should be ready by fall.
 - 2. The snack bar and elevator installation has been completed at the Williamson Campus.
 - 3. Based on recommendations from the Wyoming Campus Task Force, facility renovations are taking place at the campus, and three new complete programs will be offered at the campus Fall 2005.
 - 4. The ground breaking ceremony for the Allied Health and Technology Center was held today, Tuesday, April 19, 2005, at the Logan Campus.
- 16. Commencement will be held May 14, 2005 at 10:00 a.m. at the Earl Ray Tomblin Convention Center, Chapmanville, WV.
- 17. The U. S. Department of Education awarded Southern \$253,858 in grant funds for continuation of the Student Support Services Program.

18. We have submitted a GEAR UP (Gaining Early Awarness and Readiness for Undergraduate Programs) grant proposal to the U. S. Department of Education for consideration. The GEAR UP program is a discretionary grant program designed to increase the number of low-income students who are prepared to enter and succeed in postsecondary education.

RESOLVED, That the Southern West Virginia Community and Technical College Board of Governors approve the proposed resident tuition increase of 4.53% and attached special course-related fees; and a nonresident tuition and fee increase of 5.18% for fiscal year 2005-2006 effective July 1, 2005.

Secretary Perry recommended the review process for tuition and fees begin Fall 2005 so information can be made available to students early in the spring semester.

6. Approval of FY 2006 Budget

1. Parcel #56-0088-000

MOTION: Jada Hunter moved the adoption of the following resolution:

RESOLVED, that the Southern West Virginia Community and Technical College Board of Governors approve the purchase of real property known as "Part of Lot #2, Town of Holt," Mount Gay, WV, in the County of Logan, WV, Logan County Assessor's Parcel #56-0088-000 for the amount of \$60,000.00 for future development.

4. Discussion Items

1. Report on Finance Unit Action Plan for Achievement of the *Compact for West Virginia 2010*

As charged by President Tomblin and the Board of Governors of Southern West Virginia Community and Technical College, the Finance Unit has developed an action plan for implementation of the *Compact for West Virginia 2010.* Mr. Fred Scott, Vice President for Finance, presented the unit's goals, strategies and target dates for completion

2. Report on Dental Hygiene Program

Ms. Pamela Alderman provided an overview of the accreditation site visit that took place April 12-13, 2005. The visiting team made some recommendations to work on prior to the July meeting of the American Dental Association. Fourteen applicants for the Dental Hygiene Program were accepted for the Fall 2005 semester.

3. Legislative Bills

- 1. Senate Bill 603 will provide flexibility measures for certain state institutions of higher education.
- 2. The West Virginia Legislature is likely to return to Charleston for a third special session in September to discuss pay raises and equity for state employees.

4. Board of Governors Retreat

The Board will hold its annual planning retreat October 20-21, 2005. The group would like to hold the retreat at Snowshoe Mountain, Lakeview, or The General Lewis Inn. Ms. Emma Baisden will check on availability for the group.

5. Adjournment

There being no further business, Chair Huffman declared the meeting adjourned at 7:10 p.m. The next Board meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, June 21, 2005.
